Finance Report – September and October 2022

September was an amazing month of fundraising. As you will have already read in his report, Kent and Sue organised a fundraising event on the 8th September which through the generosity of friends and colleagues has raised a wonderful sum of money for the branch. Grant, our Trusts and Grants Fundraiser, has also raised £2,000 in grants from Herts County Councillors and the Rotary Club. We have also received, as mentioned in the last Newsletter, £1,161 from Charlotte's Fun Day, a further £737 in respect of Keith's Wing Walk and a further £160 from the Folk around the Tree concert. All these donations have also led to an increase in in Gift Aid, £158 in the last 2 months giving us a projected total of £758.61 for the year.

These wonderful efforts have allowed us to cover the costs of 2 Emergency Grants, a Carer's Grant and Hospital transportation costs. If there is anything that you think we might be able to fund please don't hesitate to ask.

Adult care services in Hertfordshire provide a similar card, I am a Carer, someone's safety depends on me. Contact Adult Care Services at Hertfordshire County Council on 0300 123 442 and ask about creating a Carers in Case of emergency plan.

The conversation was very varied, old bank notes were mentioned along with the worry over the huge rising costs in energy bills. On a lighter note, Vernon told us about his holidays in the Lake District and Norfolk, how accessible it was at Holkham Hall, he even managed to get a trip on the stairclimbing machine to enable him to look around the upper floor. Heather told us about her experience in a hotel in Nottingham, where she happened to be staying in a disabled room, using the toilet was not a good experience as the toilet seat fell off whilst in use, oh dear.

On Thursday 6th October POhWER held its annual information day at the Ibis Hotel in Stevenage.

POhWER is a charity and membership organisation based in Stevenage. They provide information, advice, support and advocacy to people who experience disability, vulnerability, distress and social exclusion. POhWER was set up in 1996 by service users who, tired of others making assumptions about their capabilities and views, wanted equal access to information and a voice of their own.

Kevin Sinfield OBE

Rhinos legend, Kevin Sinfield OBE was named Just Giving Celebrity Fundraiser of the Year for 2022 after his continued efforts to raise money in the fight against Motor Neurone Disease in the name of his former teammate Rob Burrow who was diagnosed with it in 2019.

Sinfield has raised millions and is preparing for his next challenge: seven ultramarathons in seven days culminating in the Rugby League World Cup Final at Old Trafford.

Kevin is the defence coach for the Leicester Tigers Rugby Union Club. He is a former rugby league player. Captain and director of football for Leeds Rhinos. He has represented England and Great Britain. He is widely regarded as one of the greatest kickers in rugby league history.

He is now also fundraising for former rugby union player, Doddie Weir and former footballer Stephen Darby, both have been diagnosed with MND.
