Message from the Chair

The attendance at our AGM this year was abysmal and we appreciated the presence of Colin Smith who was the only member, apart from the committee, to turn up! As usual there were no nominations or volunteers for the committee and the present committee was duly returned for another year. It is a cause for concern that we are unable to attract new folk onto the committee as we play a vital role in attracting funds, to be used locally, which would otherwise go to National Office or to other charities. Arrangements are well in hand for the 20th Anniversary celebration on the 30th May and we look forward to seeing those of you, who have responded, on that day.

Here is a brief summary of my report at the AGM.:-

'Since the last AGM we have introduced a mix of day and evening meetings with more social 'get-togethers' which have proved successful in attracting more folk Donations, proceeds from a range of fund –raising activities and street collections etc. continue to help maintain a healthy bank balance so that we are able to respond quickly to local requests for help as well as contributing to appeals from national office for specific projects and research.

We discussed changing from 'Branch' status to a 'Group' but decided against this as there would still be a need for a group of people to run this. Our bank account would also be held by the association and could delay our response to requests for help.

Geoff has taken over the organisation of the street collections, as well as his role as treasurer and I must thank him and the members who help on the day. Thanks must also go to Chris, Derek and Alan who produce an excellent newsletter, to our association visitors Chris Jane Lesley and Maria, and to Annette and Jon for producing the revised Branch leaflet and web site. And last but not least thanks to all the committee and Marilyn our secretary for all the work they put in on behalf of the Branch.

In spite of committee problems, the Branch continues to flourish and we appreciate the loyal support of members, which ensures our continued existence and ability to support those with MND in this area.'

Some further information on the very special Walk to De'Feet with the potential to raise some substantial funding. It takes place on the 29th of June at the Oshwal Centre in Northaw, close to Potters Bar. The 10 KM walk will gather a group of walkers from several different charities including ours. - Trophies for all under 16's and the highest three adult sponsor forms

Our Speaker at the AGM

We were very privileged to have the pleasure of listening to Karen Pearce, Director of Care for the MNDA at our AGM on the 30th April, which was missed by so many.

Karen described what was a very successful year for the Association telling us the financial position was much more stable, there was more support provided through volunteers, MND Connect, regional teams and financial support services with an excellent year of awareness raising. There had been another brilliant International Research Symposium and the NICE guideline on MND is starting.

She said improvement was still needed in shortening time to diagnosis, increasing in the number of people with MND referred to the Association, also improvements to social care and better integration of health & social care. There were more people accessing specialist MND multidisciplinary care and improving support to carers and children.

There is an important new aspect of our strategy in response to strong feedback through the consultation process, we have added Campaigning and Awareness Raising alongside Care and Research. The vision remains the same accept A World Free From MND.

The Association has three mission areas:

- To improve care and support for people with MND, their families and carers.
- To fund and promote research that leads to new understanding and treatments and bring us closer to a cure for MND.
- To campaign and raise awareness.

There have been recent achievements in care with 19 Care Centres, 8,000 MND Connect enquiries per year, approximately 320 AV's supporting 1,300 people. There have been wheelchair and volunteer grants, 1,000 pieces of equipment have been provided with financial support of £400,000 (422 people) plus a Red Flag project with GP's.

Karen told us she had National Responsibilities which included 9 Care Centres/Networks. Support services included Equipment Loan and MND support grants plus Care Administration lead by the Projects Team. Karen also gives support across the Association as a Data Protection Officer, responsible for Campaigning - influencing specialist services, Fundraising and Research of health and care related work. She told us that Staff and Volunteers continue to increase our understanding of the needs of people with MND and their families. She said Volunteers and staff are working in partnership and there is a strong partnership with our branches and groups.

Also there had been improved recruitment, training and support which better reflects the needs of people living with MND from diverse backgrounds. Finally she told us 'We are all part of the Association Jigsaw'.

Our grateful thanks go to Karen for such an enlightening talk given us in such an interesting way.

Coordinator post made permanent in Hertfordshire

Local NHS decision makers have agreed to fund an innovative post that supports people living with motor neurone disease (MND) and other rapidly progressing neurological conditions in Hertfordshire, following calls from local people and the MND Association.

Herts Valleys and East & North Hertfordshire Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs), who buy NHS services for Hertfordshire, have confirmed that they will fully fund the post of Specialist Neurological Conditions Coordinator after charitable money from the MND Association and The John Ellerman Foundation ends.

The role has had a big impact since its introduction in 2011. As well as achieving cost savings by reducing the number of unnecessary admissions to hospital, it has improved the quality of life and experience of people with these devastating diseases.

The post was formerly held by Liz Garrood, the new postholder will be starting in the next few weeks, exact date to be confirmed.
